Question: Two potential sites have been identified on Hong Kong Island for the setting up of

LPG filling stations and a tendering exercise is planned in this connection. Please

provide information on the timetable for the project.

Reply:

In a recent site search, we have found two potential sites on Hong Kong Island for setting up LPG-cumpetrol refilling stations – one at Fung Mat Road in the Western District and the other at Tin Wan. The site at Fung Mat Road is being used as a temporary carpark for commercial vehicles (including goods vehicles and coaches). To make way for setting up the LPG-cum-petrol refilling station at Fung Mat Road, we will soon consult the transport trades on the relocation of the temporary carpark. We will also consult the Central and Western District Council and Harbourfront Commission's Task Force on Harbourfront Developments on Hong Kong Island around mid-2012 about setting up the station. As for the Tin Wan site, which is being used as a temporary works area for the Harbour Area Treatment Scheme Stage 2A, we will consult the Southern District Council and the taxi and light bus trades around mid 2012 about our proposal.

Question: What is the timetable for constructing the noise barrier at Chai Wan Road in Chai Wan?

Reply:

Regarding the noise barrier retrofit works of the section of Chai Wan Road, the consultant engaged by the Highways Department (HyD) proposed a combination of semi-enclosure and cantilevered noise barriers, and relocating the bus stop nearby to make available space for the retrofitting of noise barriers. To update residents of Eastern District on the conceptual design and the related works of the noise barriers, the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) and the HyD had briefed the Eastern District Council on several occasions. The latest update was on 2 February 2012. The EPD and HyD will endeavour to bring forward the noise barrier retrofit works according to the established mechanism and procedures of the Public Works Programme, and work out the construction timetable in the light of the progress.

<u>Question</u>: Regarding "continue to encourage franchised bus companies to deploy environment-friendly buses at busy corridors", will the Administration inform this Committee of the following:

- (a) When the pre-trial work on electric buses will be completed; and
- (b) What measures have been taken to encourage bus companies and the transportation industry to use electric vehicles.

#### Reply:

- (a) The Government has earmarked \$180 million for franchised bus companies to purchase 36 electric buses for trial runs on a number of routes to assess their performance in different conditions. We are working with the franchised bus companies on the trial arrangement with an aim to seek funding approval from the Finance Committee towards the middle of this year for starting the trial around the end of 2013. The trial will last for two years to allow a comprehensive assessment of the operational efficiency and performance of the buses. An interim review will be carried out about one year after the start of the trial.
- (b) The Government has also set aside \$300 million under the Pilot Green Transport Fund to support the transport sector to test out green and innovative transport technologies, including electric vehicles (EVs). As at the end of February 2012, we approved 24 applications involving the trial of electric buses, electric goods vehicles as well as hybrid goods vehicles, involving a sum of more than \$60 million. Moreover, the Government has extended the waiver of First Registration Tax for EVs for a period of five years till the end of March 2014. The Government has also accelerated the tax deduction for capital expenditure on EVs as from 18 June 2010, such that enterprises can enjoy a 100% profits tax deduction in the first year of procurement.
