	400 year-old Hakka village of Mui Tsz Lam. Experimental
	architectural demonstrations that conserve past heritage and
	explore future rural living will act as catalysts to test out the
	feasibility of sustainable operations to revive the village in the long
	run. Three target built heritages (Old House, Auxiliary Block,
	Mural House) in two sites will be tested. One site will renew old
	traditions by pioneering local rammed earth reconstructions to
	create an "Open-air living Hakka culture gallery" that respects
	Place by caring for historical, cultural and natural heritages, the
	other site will test alternative sustainable restoration to design a
	"Future countryside living experiential centre" for co-creating a
	flexible multi-use community space.
	Engaging villagers and the general public will enrich the software
	aspects of the target built heritage restorations. Fundamental
	infrastructure constraints and how programme potential also
	depends on the relevant regulatory requirements will also be
	considered. The two demonstration sites hope to regenerate
	Place by reconnecting People via a collaborative Process. The
	results will be reviewed to formulate a feasibility study for
	comprehensive village-wide restoration matching village character
	and aspirations, buying-in more inter-generational villagers to
	resettle, eventually reviving Mui Tsz Lam as a "living village"
	ecology.
